# PEER TUTORING

As the year progresses and as you move through high school, you will find that the courses become more and more challenging. If you are experiencing difficulties in a course the Student Services Department at Applewood Heights Secondary School is here to provide some options.

The following are a series of questions that will help you understand our tutoring program.



## WHAT IS PEER TUTORING?

Peer tutoring is a service that is organized by the counsellors in Student Services which provides students who are in need of assistance in a subject to drop in as necessary and get help from a senior student who is willing and eager to help.

## WHO ARE THE TUTORS?

The tutors are senior students from our school who have shown not only academic excellence in an area of study, but also dedication, commitment and an interest in helping others.

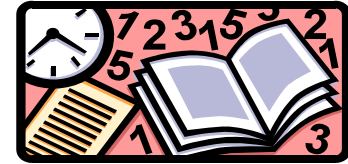
## WHO IS A TUTEE?

A tutee is generally a junior student, but it may also be a senior student. This student has either identified themselves as in need of extra help, or their teacher may have recommended additional support.

## WHEN AND WHERE IS TUTORING OFFERED?

Tutoring sessions will take place once every four-day cycle for each compulsory subject. This means that a tutee may get help once every four days per subject.

Sessions take place in Student Services during periods 3 and 4. Tutors will be available the last half of each period.



## WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS?

As a tutor, you gain excellent experience with helping others and reviewing material. You are also eligible for hours to go towards your OSSD mandatory forty hours of community service.

As a tutee, you get exceptional assistance from your peers; those who may have experienced the same difficulties that you have and have succeeded.
